SECTION VII - PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

Gloves: Rubber gloves. Confirm with a reputable supplier first.
Eye Protection: Safety glasses

Engineering Controls: General ventilation normally adequate.

SECTION VIII - FIRST AID

Eye: Flush with cool water. Remove contact lenses, if applicable, and continue flushing. Obtain medical attention if irritation persists.
Skin: Flush with cool water. Wash with soap and water. Obtain medical attention if irritation persists.
Inhalation: If symptoms develop move victim to fresh air. If symptoms persist, obtain medical attention.
Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with water, then drink one or two glasses of water. Obtain medical attention. Never give anything by mouth if victim is unconscious, or is convulsing.
